### 1. What is a Parable?

- The classic definition of a parable is "an <u>earthly</u> story with a <u>heavenly</u> meaning."
- A parable unexplained is a <u>riddle</u>.

## 2. Why did Jesus speak in Parables?

- Jesus spoke in parables as a response to their unbelief. Mt. 13:14, 12:14
- When Jesus spoke in parables it was a judgement. Mark 4:10–12
- "They (parables) are not neat little stories that make things <u>clear</u>. They are actually <u>puzzling</u> stories that <u>invite you in!</u>" Tim Mackie

### 3. How do we learn from Parables?

- We treat each parable as <u>unique</u>. There is no <u>formula</u> or <u>pattern</u>.
- We look for the indicators:
  - a) The original audience
  - b) The original setting
  - c) The aha moment
    - The connection point
    - The sucker punch unexpected turn
    - The point of view
  - d) The (KEY) is the <u>response</u> of the original audience
- The problem is not with <u>understanding</u> but with letting the parables alter our <u>behavior!</u>

## **Application:**

- 1) Each parable contains theology! Is my heart open to learn what God has for me?
- 2) Am I willing to see myself in each parable even when it is difficult to face?
- 3) For His kingdom to come, will I choose to allow the King to rule in my heart?
