#### The Good Samaritan

Pastor Mark Wilks, LUKE 10:25-37

# 1. The Ultimate question.

- The lawyer wrongly assumes he is doing this or doesn't want to face the truth.
- For the Jew, a neighbor is someone who does good things for you.
- The lawyer want's something that at least can be calculated.

## 2. The Ultimate <u>response/parable</u>.

- The difference between the three: only one <u>had compassion</u>.
- The Samaritan's compassion compelled him to action.
- This parallels God's love for broken humanity.

## 3. The Ultimate allegory.

- An allegory is a story with <u>symbolic</u> fictional figures with corresponding <u>truths</u>.
- Jesus is the <u>ultimate Good Samaritan!</u> Only he <u>can save us</u>.
- This parable is meant to <u>alter our behavior</u>; but, the key is we cannot <u>live up to this standard</u>.

# **Application:**

- 1) Be <u>real</u>: We don't <u>love God</u> as commanded. We are the <u>broken man</u>.
- 2) A neighbor is anyone God puts in my path.
- 3) The only true and perfect Samaritan is <u>Jesus</u>.

### Augustine interpretation of the parable of the Good Samaritan:

A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho = Adam *Jerusalem* = the heavenly city of peace, from which Adam fell Jericho = the moon, and thereby signifies Adam's mortality *robbers* = the devil and his angels *stripped him* = of his immortality beat him = by persuading him to sin leaving him half dead = as a man he lives, but he died spiritually; therefore he is half dead the priest and Levite = the priesthood and ministry of the Old Testament the Samaritan = is said to mean Guardian; therefore Christ himself is meant bandaged his wounds = binding the restraint of sin oil = comfort of good hope wine = exhortation to work with a fervent spirit donkey ("beast") = the flesh of Christ's incarnation inn =the church the next day = after the Resurrection two silver coins = promise of this life and the life to come  $innkeeper = Paul^1$
