Parable of the Talents

Pastor Mark Wilks, MATTHEW 25:14-30

Big idea: Pleasing the Lord as we await His return.

1. Everyone gets equal <u>trust</u> and <u>opportunity</u>.

- God never <u>demands</u> from us anything which we have not <u>received from Him</u>.
- Immediately (*at once*) without hesitation shows an <u>eagerness to obey</u>.
- The talents can represent: <u>abilities</u>, <u>gifts</u>, <u>knowledge</u>, <u>finances</u>, <u>etc</u>.

2. Everyone is expected to seize your opportunities.

- "Presupposed in the parable is the truth that Jesus' followers joyfully recognize their <u>role</u> and respond as slaves with <u>gratitude</u> to improve their master's assets." D.A. Carson
- The wicked servant thought the job was too difficult.

3. Everyone will be evaluated based on their efforts and attitudes.

- God sees right through the slave's <u>cheesy</u> excuses and <u>ours too</u>!
- If you call yourself a servant of the Lord; you don't have the <u>right to withdraw</u> your <u>services</u> from the Lord.
- In the end, the two used there opportunity to serve the Lord and proved the <u>sincerity</u> of their <u>salvation</u>.
- Nobody can accuse Jesus of being <u>unclear</u>! <u>Use it or lose it.</u>

- 2) Would I be doing things differently if it were <u>up to me</u>?
- 3) What would those closest to me say <u>my ministry is</u>?
